

# Mapping regional involvement in EU affairs

With its final conference, the research project REGIOPARL seeks to address recent developments and open questions in the field of regional studies as well as regional politics with regards to their involvement on EU level. In three academic panels, an expert roundtable and during a workshop, questions such as: how and why do regional level political actors actually engage in EU affairs? Are they currently just bystanders or do they actively get involved in shaping European policy? What form of participation would they like to see in a newly constituted Europe? And could they act as a link between EU citizens and institutions within the multi-level polity? will be discussed with representatives from academia, politics and administration.

<u>REGIOPARL</u> (<u>Regional Parliaments Lab</u>) is a multi-annual international research project on the role of regional parliaments in the EU multilevel system of governance. REGIOPARL is hosted at Danube University Krems and funded by Forum Morgen (Austria).
